The workers, who are both men and women, attend English as a Second Language classes, computer, leadership, and job skills training, and can obtain legal, medical, and dental services and referrals.

The Day Worker Center is a valuable and surprisingly under-used asset to our community.

Do you have a yard or land that you can no longer maintain, due to health or economic need?

You can have your unused land turned into a beautiful, well-maintained organic garden by loaning your yard to "Victoria Verde"

THE PROJECT:

- "Victoria Verde" (Green Victory) is a gardening project that links seniors and gardener/day workers from the Day Worker Center of Mountain View.
- The workers will receive training in organic gardening techniques in cooperation with volunteers from Master Gardeners.
- Using these techniques, gardening teams will do yard cleanup, prepare the soil, plant, cultivate, and harvest seasonal vegetables in the volunteers' yards.
- The seniors will decide how much of the harvest they choose to keep and how much they want to donate to the Day Worker Center of Mountain View, Second Harvest, or any other non-profit organization.
- The project is funded by Presbyterian Church Self-Development of People.

WHO BENEFITS:

- Senior volunteers benefit by having their unused yards/land turned into organic gardens, plus choose how much of the harvest to keep and what to donate.
- Workers benefit by receiving valuable vocational training in organic gardening techniques that will increase their employment opportunities.
- Your neighborhood and the environment benefit by encouraging green gardening.
- The non-profits you choose benefit from the donation of fresh, organic produce.

Commonly Asked Questions

How do I hire someone? drop by the center and our b

Please call or drop by the center and our bilingual staff will help locate someone who meets your needs.

What about English and job skills?
Our staff will assist you in finding someone with the lan-

guage and job skills to suit your needs.

How much should I pay? \$10-\$15 per hr is suggested, with higher pay for special

skills. Agreement on pay rate must be done before leaving the center. Payment in full is expected daily.

How much will go to the worker?

All of your payment will go to the worker. The Day Worker Center does not charge for its services.

What about transportation?

Although some workers have bicycles, you should plan on picking them up and returning them to the center.

Any other suggestions?

Some workers will not have food or drink with them. Please

offer them something through out the day.
Also show them the nearest restroom.
