The Art of Compost

Workers recently increased their job skills by learning how to turn food scraps and yard trimmings into healthy garden fertilizer. A Master Composter from UC's Compost Education Program of Santa Clara County showed workers how to build compost piles and worm bins, and how to apply the finished fertilizer in landscapes and gardens. With more practice and experience workers, hope to offer their composting skills to employers in the future.

DID YOU KNOW...

Three years into the pandemic much of the country has moved on, but the number of workers hired through the Center remains very low. From January through October this year, 262 compañeres served 1,108 employers.

Seniors Helping Seniors

Two groups with unmet needs inspired the Day Worker Center's **Seniors Helping Seniors** project.

Executive Director María Marroquin explains that community seniors often need assistance with tasks like gardening, laundry, or cleaning but, given limited social security income, may find hiring help too costly. Senior workers who could provide that help are

sometimes passed over in the hiring process by employers who mistakenly believe younger workers are better. Says María, "Actually, older workers are often more experienced—and more committed to working, since they've been passed over so many times."

Seniors Helping Seniors is a win-win project: senior employers receive needed help and senior day laborers gain more work.

A generous grant from the <u>Kiwanis Club of</u> <u>Mountain View</u> covers the \$50 voucher for the worker's labor.

If you're 65 or older and need a hand with a house or yard task, call 650.903.4102 to sign up at least a day in advance to make sure a senior worker is available for your project.

Healthy Meals To Go

COVID-19 threw the Center yet another curveball when we could no longer offer dine-in hot meals for workers. But we adapted on the fly to provide take-away meals.

Our cooks whomp up nutritious, balanced meals six days a week for families in needmore than 15,250 meals from January through October this year. Breakfast and lunch are available Monday through Saturday.

Included are tasty favorites like nopales, made from prickly-pear cactus paddles, and home-made tortillas. As part of our sustainability efforts, all utensils and take-out trays are compostable.
