


# VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT

Since becoming a volunteer back in 2007, Steve has helped with the
worker's list that organizes which worker is next to go out for a job,
technology issues, and for events like tabling at the Art & Wine Festival
of Mountain View and Los Altos. As volunteer, Steve also coordinated a
partnership between the Center and Stanford Blood Center in which their
mobile unit came our facility to give workers and community members
an opportunity to donate blood.

In 2010 Steve helped with permits and coordinating the Center's big move from Mercy St. to 113 Escuela Ave. In our current building, Steve also helped with the process of gettings solar panels installed. He looked for vendors and coordinated the installation. No matter what the need may be, Steve is always ready to lend a hand!

#### WHY DID YOU WANT TO VOLUNTEER AT THE CENTER?
